

They received flowers during tough times of their own". Bates, who lost her husband to cancer earlier this year, said she received a call from Fountaine once when her husband was hospitalized. Fountaine was calling from the hospital, too. Jones said she had a knack for knowing what might make someone's day a little brighter. "Although she faced significant challenges with her physical health that sometimes made it difficult to even get dressed in the morning, Carla was more full of life than anyone," he said.



According to her obituary in The Columbus Dispatch, Fountaine described herself as Nationwide Children's Hospital's "boots on the ground" in the community. It's a role her family said she served "with unmatched authenticity, rigor and love."

She was also a voracious reader, dedicated foodie and knowledgeable film buff who was as devoted to her family as she was her work. Three weeks before her death, on her 43rd birthday, Fountaine posted a thank-you to all her on Facebook friends and reflected on what she called an "immensely difficult" 11/2 years. She said she had promised herself that through all difficulties she would "always be me" and pronounced herself "proud of the strides I made and will continue to make in this life." "If I can leave this world with only one lesson ... please live every day to the fullest and make sure you are there when your people really need you," she said.

both. Fountaine, who in 20 years rose from a Community Relations Assistant for the hospital to its Director of Community Relations, passed away on July 26, 2024, at the age of 43. In recognition of her passion for the work she did and the people she helped, the Southeast Lions has selected Carla Fountaine as the recipient of its second annual Lifetime Achievement Award.

"She had this way of getting people to connect," said Donna Bates, who received the award in 2023 and will present this year's honor to Fountaine's mother. "She never asked for any attention or recognition. Her goal was always that we can work together to make the community a better place."

For the Southeast Lions, Fountaine served as a Board Member and Membership Chair. She sponsored new club members and volunteered for the

At Nationwide Children's, Fountaine was a big part of the hospital's efforts to invest in the South Side community and its residents during an ambitious development plan that since 2008 has doubled the size of its South Side medical campus.

"Her work with NCH was her passion, not just being an advocate, protector, for the hospital,

The fun part of all this is that everyone comes out in February to mingle. Senator Hearcel Craig and Auditor Michael Stinziano, City Council's Nancy Sully, Liaison Katherine Cull, Judges, CEO's, Neighborhood Civic Leaders and more are always in attendance.

Businesses love being chosen to even lobbying to host twice or three times like Ace Hardware, Kroger, and Rent-A-Center. It is a great way to bring customers in during the cold season and to highlight new hot spots such as Parsons North Brewery. One time the February party was held in an empty storefront on Reinhard and Parsons where a daycare now leases!

The best part of House Sweet It Is is the house tour. Guests hop on a bus and visit NCH Healthy Families, Healthy Homes renovated homes. The initial program began in Southern Orchards, a declining neighborhood adjacent to the hospital. Vacant homes were purchased and fully restored. The completed houses offered sales incentives such as a ten-year tax abatement, new

appliances and a 3% downpayment. It attracted first-time homeowners and those hospital employees wanting to own property near work. Buyers are required to live in the home for five years to help stabilize the neighborhood and reduce flipping. Healthy Homes has revitalized Southern Orchards and added portions of Ganthers Place to the mix. The program continues today, offering more rental housing, and some new builds and has expanded north to Linden.


Healthy Homes has been a total success according to Lion Sherri Palmer. She climbed on the tour bus in February 2015 with her pal Allen Carrol. Palmer, a 37year renter of the SAME east-side apartment had no thoughts of buying. But one house clearly had her name all over it. She was immediately smitten and Caroll told her she absolutely had to

buy the house. Patty Lamb, a longtime South Side realtor made the sale, and in turn they became fast friends.

"It was a no-brainer to move to the South Side," said Palmer. "I made many dear friends on the South Side through my work for Keep Columbus Beautiful. Buying the house was a perfect fit and the best decision I ever made." Lion Donna Hughes and her husband Mike bought around the same time down the street. Sherri and Donna joined forces to encourage Southern Orchards residents to beautify their homes by planting bulbs and flowers. The neighborhood now has a successful annual garden tour.

House Sweet It Is an example of how a one event can make a difference in the revitalization and pride of a community. The 2025 event will be held again at Ace Hardware.

Canine Companions Project Sponsorship 2024

On Friday, August 9th, the Southeast Lions sponsored Canine Companions' North Central Region quarterly graduation ceremony through a \$2,500 donation to Lions Project. Lions Project is a foundation within Lions International that was created with the specific purpose of supporting Canine Companions. The Southeast Lions are also proud to become a member club this year and will be supporting Lions Project for many years to come.

Several members of our Club attended the August graduation to witness the incredibly powerful matching ceremony between the graduating dogs and their recipients. Each of the dogs was raised by a volunteer Breeder Caretaker for the first 8 weeks of its life and a volunteer Puppy Raiser for the next 16 months. These volunteers are critical to the mission of Canine Companions, as they absorb the associated vetting and supply costs to support the end goal - providing service dogs to people completely free of charge.

Each recipient of a Canine Companions dog must attend Team Training onsite for two weeks, in order for the recipients to learn all that the dogs know. Within this graduating class, there were nine dogs matched as service dogs to people with physical or cognitive disabilities to assist with their daily tasks. In addition, there were four dogs matched as "facility dogs", who will be accompanying their recipient to work each day to support their clients. One of these facility dogs, Dino, has some Southend roots! He was raised by Jackie Trucco Taliani and named in memory of Alissa Trucco (both of whom are granddaughters of Ray and Dolores (Zang) Trucco). Dino is matched with a physician in Marion and will be joining her at work each day to assist with her patients' needs.

One of our own Lions, Ashley Ballard, is currently raising a puppy, Sly, who was also named in memory of her cousin Alissa. Libby and Mark Trucco, along with Mark's daughter Jackie, created the Alissa Trucco Memorial Foundation to honor her life after her passing in 2016. Through their foundation, they have raised over \$120,000 for Canine Companions, which has allowed them to name 8 puppies. Sly is #5 and there are 3 more yet to be named! Sly will be turned in for professional training in May 2025 and then will hopefully be matched with a recipient by early 2026. In the meantime, you can catch him at an upcoming Lions event or meeting!

Each year, Canine Companions has four graduation ceremonies – typically in February, May, August, and November. These dates are posted on canine.org as soon as they are available.
